Introduction and Context

Llanvaches Community Council is a small rural village located about midway between the market town of Chepstow and the city of Newport. The village lies just north of the A48 road and below Wentwood, with both Newport centre and Chepstow about 7 miles distant. The vast majority of the local government services impacting biodiversity are provided by the city council rather than at community council level however it is responsible for providing two green spaces, Glebeland Football Field and Wentwood Drive Play area, which have an impact on biodiversity.

We serve 236 residents and the precept for 2019/20 is £4,817.00. Due to its small size, Llanvaches Community Council currently does not fall under the scope of the Well- Being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 and consequently does not produce an Annual Report detailing its activities during the preceding twelve months.
